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20th Anniversary Concert Date:	Sunday April 18, 2010
Time:	3:00 PM. <i>Please arrive by 2:15 so that we can go over some info about the concert, where you will be placed, etc.</i>
Location:	The Calvary United Methodist Church 427 South Washington Street Circleville, Ohio

The plans for the concert at this time include:

- **Tuesday 4-13-2010 6:00-7:00 PM, (Preliminary practice: (Circleville Pumpkin Show Band Hall):**
If you can attend the above practice, we can go over the music and logistics for the concert with you. It isn't necessary for you to attend this practice, but you are certainly welcome to attend if you want. While we start at 6:00, if you get there by 6:30-6:45 or so we can still go over stuff with you.
- **Sunday 4-18-2010, Day of Concert, Please arrive by 2:15 PM:**
The concert will start at 3:00, but we would ask everyone to be there by 2:15 to go over the music if needed and see where everyone will be placed during the group songs. In all group songs, we will be standing (if you are able), except for the tuba and percussion, and you will be placed in specific areas based on the instrumentation we can get from everyone who will be able to attend the concert.

We will have some extra music stands, but feel free to bring your own in order to make sure we have enough.

- **FIRST Song:**
Everyone will play “*The Entertainer*”. I have attached your copy of the music. This was one of the first songs in our library, and was arranged by Mr. Kerns. As the song starts, The Pickaway Brass will be coming in from the back of the church to join with everyone else who will also be playing and stationed (standing) in front of the pulpit

For the trumpet players (for all songs), I have included both Bb Trumpet 1 and Bb Trumpet 2. If you have a preference, go ahead and pick it. We are just happy to have you back with us. If you don't have a preference, you can wait until we get together on the 18th to see how many already have selected a specific part.

- **SECOND Song:**
The Klaxon
- **Middle of Concert:**
This will be done by The Pickaway Brass
- **FINAL (almost) Song:**
Everyone will come back up and play “*Stars and Stripes Forever*”. Jarrad (trombone) and Mr. Kerns (if he wants) will play the piccolo part the first time through the trio. Anybody else who wants is welcome to play the piccolo part on the trio the second time through. If you want to do it, I have a copy of the piccolo part I can send you for either bass or treble clef. Plus, I can transpose it for those ambitious french horn players, if anyone wants.
- **ENCORE:**
Everyone will play “*Lassus Trombone*”. This is an easy one, a crowd favorite, and we should have several trombones there for the concert.
- **Duration of Concert:**
Everything should be over by 4:30 PM. (*Except, of course, for autographs, photo ops, media interviews from Entertainment Tonight, etc.*)
