PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

My eye glasses broke last week. I went to adjust them and pop...they broke...just like that; all I did was touch them. I had to bring out an older pair from a few years ago. I can still see, but the prescription isn't right. So, reading now has become an aerobic exercise, moving my head up and down to focus; moving my arms in and out to make the text readable; bobbing my head back and forth. My eyes hurt, my neck hurts, and my arms are tired from holding the paper way out in front. Fortunately, this problem will not be a problem in a couple of weeks. I'll get my new pair, and they will be better suited to my current eyesight.

All that got me thinking about how we see things in life and in ministry. As we age our eyes change, first we need glasses, then we need newer prescriptions. Keeping your current glasses longer than you should or trying to use an older pair lead to the same thing --blurry vision, and a lot of unnecessary movement!

How do we see the resurrected Jesus in the world? In your eyes, is He outshining the world, or is the world outshining Him? Where is the evidence that God is active in our lives? We see God through prayer and study of scripture. We encounter the living Christ in worship and in fellowship. Where and how we find God changes the older we get -- or should I say the more experiences of life we have. And, sometimes we need new glasses or a new way to focus to better see God active in our life. May this Easter season be a time to see the living Lord active in our world.
