REV. JOHN O. WOODS, COL. (RET.) NATIONAL CHAPLAIN – HONORARY NATIONAL CHAPLAIN HONORARY NATIONAL COMMANDER

September 20, 1907 – August 7, 2005

Rev. John O. Woods, D.D., son of the late Rev. and Mrs. Oscar Woods was born September 20, 1907, in Laramie, WY. He graduated from Elderton, PA High School in 1924. Rev. Woods received his Bachelor of Arts Degree from Thiel College, Greenville, PA, in 1928 and graduated from the Chicago Lutheran Theological Seminary in 1931 with a Bachelor of Divinity Degree. He is also a graduate of the Army Chaplain School. In 1957, he was awarded the Doctor of Divinity Degree by Thiel College.

Rev. Woods was called to active duty in Virginia as a Reserve Army Chaplain from 1935 – 1939. He was commissioned in the regular Army and moved to Carlisle Barracks, PA, where he remained until 1942. He then joined the 80th Infantry Division and spent three years in

Europe where he was awarded 4 Battle Stars. Upon returning from overseas in 1945, he was assigned as Post Chaplain in Ft. Lee, VA. In 1948 he was assigned as Division Chaplain, 17th Airborne Division,

Camp Pickett, VA.

Once again, in 1949, Chaplain Woods was ordered to Germany as the Frankfurt A/M Military Post Chaplain, and six months later became Deputy Chaplain of the European Command until 1951. From 1951 – 1954, he served as Second Army Chaplain, Ft. George Meade, MD. He served as the 8th U.S. Army Chaplain, Korea from June 1954 – October 1955. From November, 1955 – July 1956, he was assigned as Post Chaplain, Ft. Knox, KY, and from 1956 – 1962 he was the XVIII Airborne Corps. Chaplain headquartered at Ft. Bragg, NC. During this time he made 90 military parachute jumps. He was the Senior Chaplain of the U.S. Army Europe from 1962 – 1966. On October 1, 1976, Chaplain Woods was retired as Chaplain (Colonel) by the U.S. Army at Valley Forge General Hospital.

Chaplain Woods, Colonel (Ret.) was awarded the following Awards and Decorations: The Legion of Merit, The Bronze Star Medal, European African Middle Eastern Theatre Ribbon with four Battle Stars, American Theatre Ribbon, American Defense Ribbon, World War II Victory Medal, Army of Occupational Ribbon, U.N. Ribbon, Korean Defense, National Defense Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, Master Parachutist Badge and the Order of the Ulchi

(Korean Medal).

Since his Army retirement on October 1, 1967 Pastor Woods

has served as supply pastor throughout Synod.

Chaplain Woods attended the 80th Division Veterans
Association Reunion regularly. He was an inspiration to all that knew him and will be sadly missed.

NOTE: Colonel Woods passing occurred after the Memorial Bulletin and the Program book had gone to the press. The Blue Rider will have an article about Colonel Woods.
