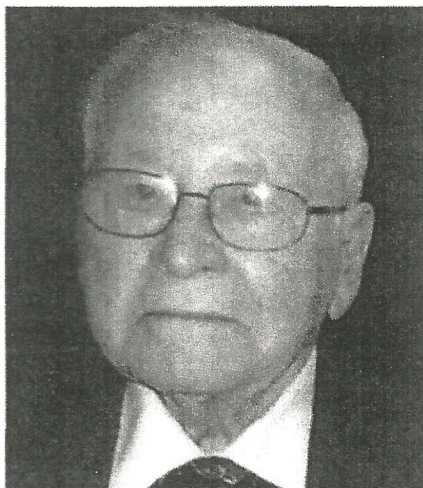

Mr. Clifford L. Kerns Passed away on August 9, 2014. He was 90 years, 2 weeks, 2 days old at the time of his death. Mr. Kerns was a member of, what Tom Brokaw called, "The Greatest Generation." Because there is not room here to tell you of all of Cliff's accomplishments, let it be said that his love of family, community, country, music and God should be an example to all of us (and these are in no specific order).

He grew up on Union Street in Circleville and graduated from Circleville High School in 1942. During World War II, Cliff served in North Africa, France and Germany in the U.S. Army. After the War, Mr. Kerns received degrees from Otterbein College and Boston University. He began his teaching career in Xenia, moved to Lorain, and, thank goodness, came back to Pickaway County, to teach at the Laurelville Schools for 6 years. He taught in the Circleville City Schools for over twenty years and was best known for his "Marching Millions:" the Circleville Jr. High Band. Mr. Kerns began directing the Circleville Pumpkin Show Community Band in 1982 and continued at that position for twenty-five years. If you were lucky enough to have him as a director, you also had a friend, a confidant, and an encourager.

Maybe what sums up Cliff more than anything is a bumper sticker that he placed on the Pumpkin Show Band room door. As we leave the room there is a reminder: "NOW GO HOME AND PRACTICE!" That did not only mean our music. It also meant life skills like working as a team, harmonizing, doing your best, and who knows how many other hidden meanings. We dedicate this concert and many to come to Mr. Clifford Kerns and we thank his family for sharing him with us.
